



ASLO & Duke University Press Partner to Launch New Journal

Limnology and Oceanography: Fluids and Environments

Duke University Press and ASLO, Advancing the Science of Limnology and Oceanography, are partnering to launch the new journal *Limnology and Oceanography: Fluids and Environments*. The partnership represents an expansion for both the Press and ASLO as the journal will explore the link between fluid dynamics and aquatic system processes and will be featured in an online-only format. The journal will begin publishing in late 2010.

Edited by Josef Daniel Ackerman, professor of physical ecology and aquatic science at the University of Guelph, *Limnology and Oceanography: Fluids and Environments* will publish inter-disciplinary limnology and oceanography research in which advection and/or diffusion or the mechanics of the media drive biological, chemical, and geological processes from molecular to system scales. To accommodate dynamic observations or theory/model development, the journal will allow appendices and supporting online materials such as databases and video.

ASLO members will have free online access to the journal. Libraries and institutions will have the option to purchase a subscription. Because the journal will be available in an online-only format, there will be no issues. Rather, articles will be uploaded and available on a rolling basis throughout the year, where one year is equivalent to one journal volume.

Ackerman will chair a special session on the new journal (IT 44) at the 2010 Ocean Sciences Meeting to be held 22-26 February 2010 in Portland, Oregon. ASLO is a co-sponsor for this meeting along with The Oceanography Society (TOS) and the American Geophysical Union (AGU).
